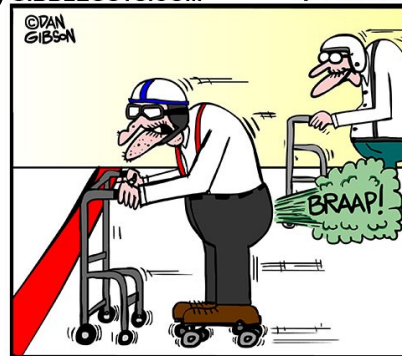

SENIORS SERVICES

Could they be a benefit to you?



Seniors Services provides preventative social programs that assist seniors and people with disabilities in maintaining their independence and enhancing their quality of life.

A housekeeping subsidy is available to assist seniors and adults with disabilities to live as independently as possible in their own safe, clean and comfortable homes.

To be eligible for the housekeeping subsidy, you must:

- be a senior (65+) or an adult with a disability or inability to complete household tasks,
- be a resident of Leduc County, Calmar, Thorsby, or Warburg, and
- have a total household income of less than \$60,000 a year (as a couple) or less than \$40,000 (as a single).

Housekeeping fees are determined based on family income level and eligibility to other subsidies. The services are provided through a partnership with *Serving Hands Senior Care Inc.*




Seniors Services also offers one-to-one support to assist you with:

- Information and referrals to other local resources
- Assistance with forms and applications
- Advocacy and coordination of services
- Goal setting and future planning direction

WARBURG ADVENTURER CLUB

What is the Adventurer Club?

A unique Christian club for children (similar in some aspects to Cubs and Brownies) where recognition is given to children as unique people with special talents. Christmas Celebrations

The Christmas Open House is scheduled for December 20th from 1:00 pm to 4:00 pm at the Village Office.

The Village Office will be closed for the Holiday Season from noon on December 24th to December 27th and again on January 1st.

Bylaw 167/19 Water, Wastewater, Solid Waste and Recycling

Bylaw 167/19 was given third and final reading and carried unanimously. This Bylaw replace the previous Bylaw with the addition of the definition of the words "Curb Stop" and the clarifications of "Curb Stop" throughout the document. In addition corrections were made to any typographical errors.

Small Business Saturday

The Village of Warburg will support and participate in Small Business Saturday on October 26th.

ICF Discussions with Leduc County

Warburg Village Council will contact Leduc County as it is currently in discussion with Leduc County regarding an Inter-Municipal Collaboration Framework. The Village is not interested in proceeding with the ICF as it stands but would like to have further discussions in this regard including a discussion concerning transportation routes.

2020 FORTIS Franchise Agreement

Village of Warburg Council moved that the FORTIS Franchise Agreement will have no changes for the year 2020.

Farm Safety Centre

The Village has donated \$200.00 to the Farm Safety Centre to support their Safety Smarts program.

Bylaw 166/19 The Procedure Bylaw

Bylaw 166/19 was given third and final reading and carried unanimously. This bylaw replaced the previous Bylaw in this regard with the change of "In Camera" to "Closed Session" as per the MGA and the moving of the location of a "Closed Session" to the Village Office basement meeting room, to protect confidentiality.

Sea Can Bylaw Appeal

Village Council supports the decision of our Bylaw Enforcement Officer for the removal of the sea can as our Village Land Use Bylaw states metal freight/cargo storage containers shall only be permitted in the Light Industrial Business District.

Warburg School Engagement

A strategy is to be developed to engage with the school in order to keep the line of communication open and to ensure the school has the opportunity to be involved in the community.

Meeting with Black Gold Regional Division No. 18

On Tuesday October 15, 2019 the Village of Warburg Council met with the Black Gold Regional Division No. 18 Council to discuss items of mutual interest and concerns.

Organizational Meeting

The Warburg Village Council Organizational Meeting was held on Tuesday October 13 at which time Council elected Councillor Kevin Maine as Mayor for the following year. Councillor Tina Smith was elected as Deputy Mayor for the next year. In addition committees, representatives and directors were appointed to the various Village Boards. A complete listing is available in the Minutes which will appear on our website once approved at the November meeting.

SNOW SEASON

Unfortunately snow season is upon us. Please remember that residents are required, per the Village Bylaw, 27/98 as amended to remove snow from sidewalks abutting their residences, within 48 hours of a snowfall. Snow/Ice that is removed from sidewalks is not allowed to be placed on Village property except in the case of an adjacent boulevard.
