SENIORS SERVICES

Could they be a benefit to you?



Seniors Services provides preventative social programs that assist seniors and people with disabilities in maintaining their independence and enhancing their quality of life.

A housekeeping subsidy is available to assist seniors and adults with disabilities to live as independently as possible in their own safe, clean and comfortable homes.

To be eligible for the housekeeping subsidy, you must:

- be a senior (65+) or an adult with a disability or inability to complete household tasks,
- be a resident of Leduc County, Calmar, Thorsby, or Warburg, and
- have a total household income of less than \$60,000 a year (as a couple) or less than \$40,000 (as a single).

Housekeeping fees are determined based on family income level and eligibility to other subsidies. The services are provided through a partnership with *Serving Hands Senior Care Inc.*



Seniors Services also offers one-to-one support to assist you with:

- Information and referrals to other local resources
- Assistance with forms and applications
- Advocacy and coordination of services
- Goal setting and future planning direction

Subsidized counselling service

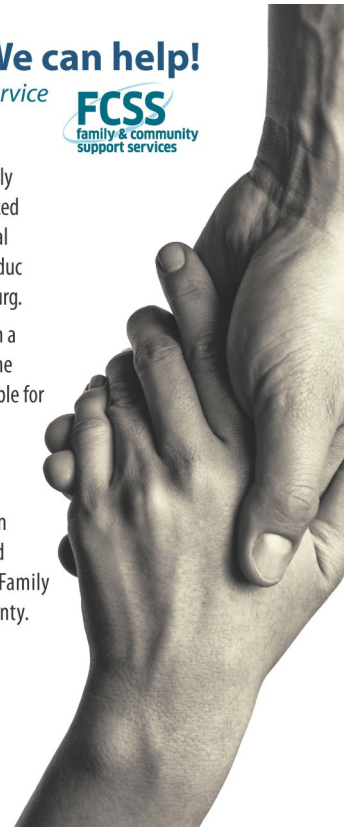

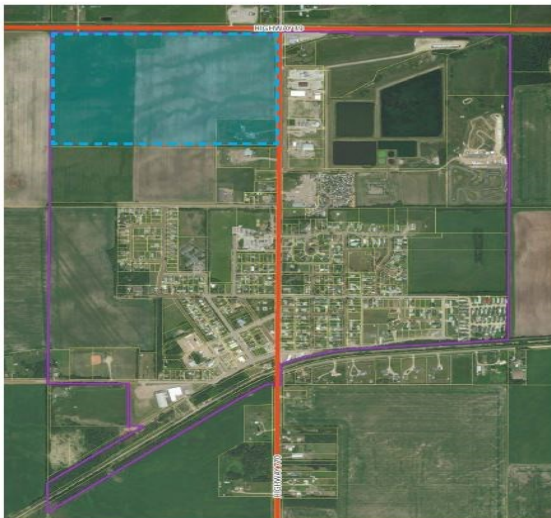
Counselling fees are determined on a sliding scale based on family income and family size. In order to be eligible for subsidy, your family income must be less than \$75,000 per year.

NOTICE

This notice is to inform residents of an update to the **Village of Warburg Municipal Development Plan (MDP)** to be adopted by Bylaw #172/20, and update to the **Village Land Use Bylaw (LUB)** #171/20. The MDP and LUB will be adopted following a public hearing, followed by a 2nd and 3rd reading of the bylaws.

PURPOSE OF UPDATE

The purpose of the proposed MDP and LUB update is to allow for a mixed-use industrial business park.

The proposed updates to the MDP are intended to enshrine the vision and principles for the site, while the proposed updates to the LUB will permit the implementation of the business park.

LUB updates include the establishment of a new zone (**Section 78: IBX Mixed Use Industrial Business Park**) and the provision of flexibility in uses throughout.

VIEWING THE UPDATED MDP & LUB

A copy of the updated MDP and LUB is available and may be reviewed by residents at the Village of Warburg Office, located at 5212 – 50 Avenue in Warburg, AB – Monday to Friday from 9:00 AM to Noon, and 1:00 PM to 4:30 PM, or online on the Village website at www.warburg.ca.

Community funding available for recreation, athletic and cultural groups

Leduc County is committed to providing funding to the region through various arts, cultural and recreation grants. Grants available for 2020 include the following:

Recreation and sport grants

Community recreation committees distribute grant funding to local recreation and athletic groups on behalf of Leduc County. Groups who received grant funding in 2019 included community halls, minor sports teams and those hosting community special events. These grants are available for groups that serve the New Sarepta, Calmar, Thorsby and Warburg region. *Groups are encouraged to contact Leduc County in advance of submitting their applications to determine eligibility.*

Mountain Pine Beetle

It has been discovered that some trees within the Village have an infestation of pine beetles. It is extremely important to remove and dispose of infested trees prior to mid-June, when mature beetles begin to emerge and fly to new trees.

Please check the trees on your property for “boring dust”, pitch tube (resin that pine trees produce to repel the beetle) and blue stain fungi. Any infested trees must be removed by May 1, 2020. Infested bark should be chipped, burned or buried to ensure adults and larvae are destroyed.

Bylaw 171/20 to Amend the Land Use Bylaw

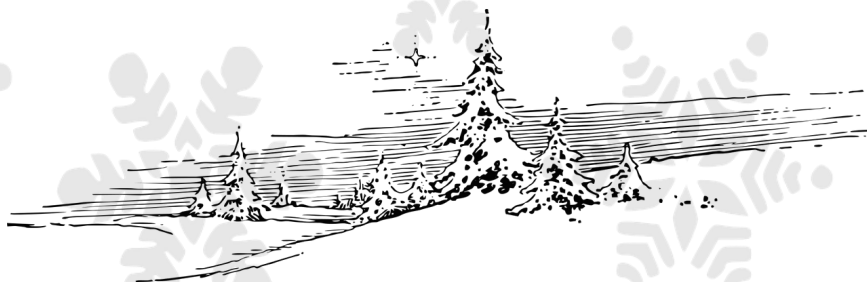
