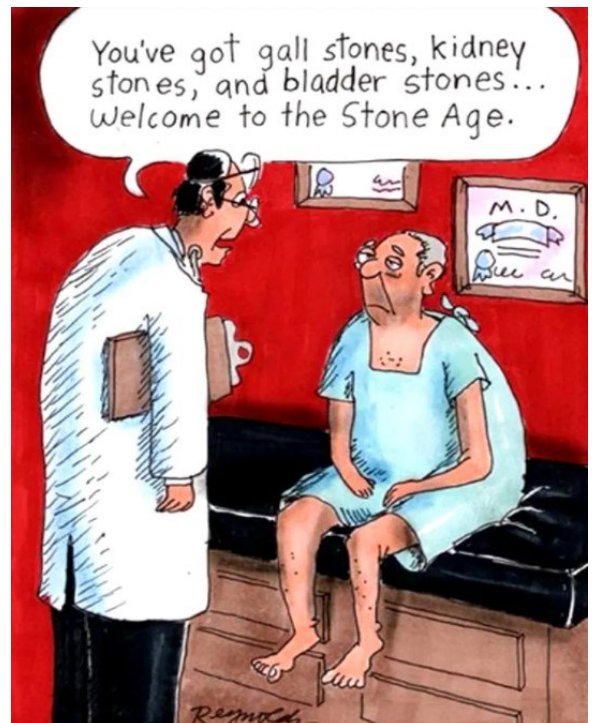

Subsidized counselling service

Short-term preventative counselling supports people who are struggling with common, everyday issues. Leduc County Family and Community Support Services (FCSS) offers subsidy to residents of rural Leduc County, Calmar, Thorsby and Warburg to ensure everyone can afford the cost of counselling.

Counselling fees are determined on a sliding scale based on family income and family size. In order to be eligible for subsidy, your family income must be less than \$75,000 per year. Services are provided by local counsellors and are available in person, over the phone or virtually.

Making Sense of Aggression

Online program

The increasing level of aggression in children has many parents and caregivers looking for an explanation as well as a solution. In the Making Sense of Aggression workshop, Dr. Gordon Neufeld sheds light on this topic, and discusses various ways aggression can show up in children, including tantrums, tempers, fits, abrasiveness, abusive language, rude gestures, hostility, racism, taunts, put-downs, bullying, fighting, shaming, belittling, name calling, vicarious enjoyment of violence or the self-attacking forms of self-deprecation, suicidal ideation and self-harm.

The workshop will focus on understanding the root causes of aggression in children and on natural interventions that go beyond symptom management, exposing its deep developmental roots and revealing why conventional approaches to the problem are so ineffective. This workshop is focused on children, but the concepts discussed apply to all ages.

This is a registered workshop that will be held virtually (online) through a secure video meeting platform. It includes four online sessions of video material along with interactive workshop activities and will be facilitated by a social worker. If you are a two-parent family, we encourage both parents to attend the sessions if possible.

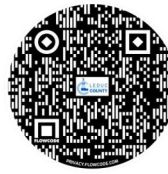

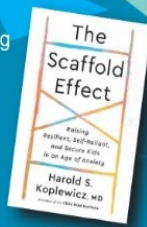

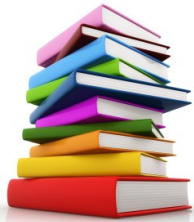

The Alberta Jobs Now Program will provide up to \$370 million to help private and non-profit businesses with job supports to get thousands of Albertans back to work. Employers can apply for funding to offset the cost of hiring and training unemployed or underemployed Albertans in a new or vacant position. This Federal-Provincial investment is the largest job training program in Alberta's history. It will support our Province's recovery, help businesses re-open or grow their workforce, and give Albertans an opportunity to gain the skills they need in today's job market.

Employers will be able to apply for a grant that covers 25% of an employee's salary for a 52 week period up to a maximum of \$25,000 per employee. The grant can be used to cover salary or training costs. Employers who hire persons with disabilities will receive a grant 1.5 times higher than the amount they would receive for other new employees.


Whereas, all levels of government, the voluntary sector and private enterprise throughout the Province participate in the planning, development and operation of recreation and parks programs, services and facilities.

WORK-SHARING PROGRAM

We have extended the maximum duration of the Work-Sharing program from 38 weeks to 76 weeks for employers affected by COVID-19. The program provides Employment Insurance (EI) benefits to eligible employees who agree to reduce their normal working hours and share the available work while their employer recovers.

CANADA EMERGENCY RENT SUBSIDY (CERS)

The Canada Emergency Rent Subsidy (CERS) provides a direct and easy-to-access rent and mortgage subsidy of up to 85% of eligible expenses to qualifying businesses, charities and non-profits. 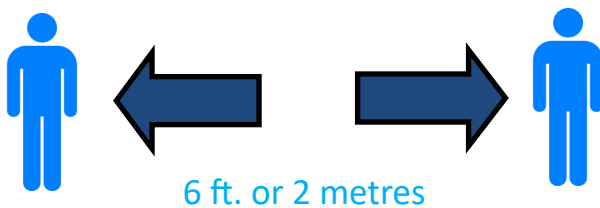
