HOW TO HELP PREVENT CANNABIS POISONING IN CHILDREN

Know the signs and what to do

Accidental poisonings in children from edible cannabis products are a serious risk. Hospitals have seen an increase in visits to the emergency room and poison centres have seen an increase in calls.

Poisonings can be life-threatening, sometimes resulting in coma, being put on a ventilator, or in rare cases, even death.

Keep cannabis away from children

- Safely store your cannabis out of reach and locked away.
- Keep edible cannabis separate from regular food and drinks.
- Choose legal cannabis products, which:
 - come in plain, child-resistant packaging; and
 - contain no more than 10 mg of THC per package, to reduce the risk of accidental poisoning.
- In contrast, illegal edible cannabis:
 - can confuse children by mimicking popular brands of candies and snacks; and
 - can contain very high amounts of THC, which increases the risk of severe cannabis poisoning.

Know the signs of a cannabis poisoning

Symptoms can include:

- Vomiting
- Confusion
- Unresponsiveness
- Slurred speech
- Unsteadiness on feet
- Drowsiness/lethargy
- Slowed breathing
- Seizures (rare)

Suspect a poisoning?

1. Call your local poison centre or 9-1-1 for emergencies.
2. Say that you suspect the symptoms are from cannabis. A quicker diagnosis can prevent serious harm to a child.

Stress and burnout generally go hand-in-hand. Burnout is what we experience after a prolonged period of unrelenting, cumulative stress – and that stress can come from any (or all) aspects of our lives. If you think of an overflowing cup that simply cannot hold anymore – that’s stress. When we just pour that cup out until there’s nothing left – that’s burnout.

Leduc County and VIV Mental Health will help participants learn the best tools to manage stress, prevent burnout, and support those who are experiencing their effects. 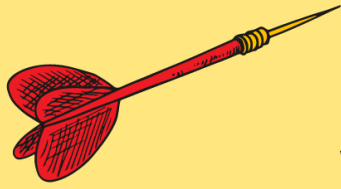

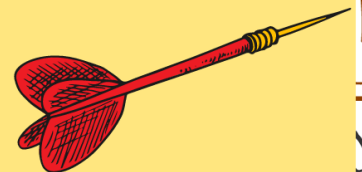

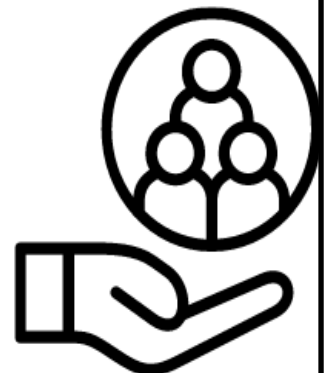

PUBLIC HEARING

Adopt Village of Warburg/Leduc County Intermunicipal Development Plan and Repeal Intermunicipal Collaboration Framework between the Village of Warburg and Leduc County

Monday, April 24, 2023, at 7:30 p.m. at Village of Warburg Office (5212-50 Avenue)

The Municipal Government Act (MGA) requires municipalities that share a common boundary to prepare and adopt matching Intermunicipal Development Plans (IDPs) and to establish Intermunicipal Collaboration Frameworks (ICFs).

In 2019, the Village of Warburg and Leduc County worked collaboratively with input from the community to prepare an IDP and ICF. Policies in the IDP and ICF require that these documents be reviewed every 4 years to ensure the principles, policies, and intermunicipal service delivery remain current. In keeping with this requirement, Councils for the Village of Warburg and Leduc County have reviewed the IDP and ICF. Minor revisions, primarily housekeeping in nature, are proposed to both the IDP and the ICF. As the MGA now allows municipalities party to an ICF to each approve the ICF by resolution, the Village of Warburg and Leduc County are proposing to repeal the ICF and approved the updated ICF by resolution to streamline the processes.

Details of the proposed bylaws to adopt the updated Village of Warburg/Leduc County IDP and repeal the ICF between the Village of Warburg and Leduc County can be found on the county's website on the public participation opportunities web page. A public hearing on the proposed bylaw to adopt the updated Village of Warburg/Leduc County IDP and the proposed bylaw to repeal the ICF between the Village of Warburg and Leduc County will be held at the **Village of Warburg (Council Chambers, 5212-50 Avenue) regular council meeting on Monday, April 24, 2023, at 7:30 p.m.** Written or oral submissions can be made by a person who claims to be affected, or from any other person council agrees to hear from.

If you want to speak at the public hearing, you must **pre-register by Wednesday, April 19, 2023 at 4:30 p.m.** You can pre-register online by emailing village@warburg.ca

Comments relating to these bylaws can be submitted by mail to Village of Warburg Box 29, Warburg, AB T0C 2T0, online by emailing to village@warburg.ca or by fax to 780-848-2296.

If you make a written submission, the information you provide may be made public, subject to the provisions of the Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act.

4. Rezoning R1, Block 12, Plan 2152 N.Y. (Reclassified from Reserve to LIB Light Industrial Business District).

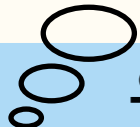

Bylaw #183/23

The first reading was given and carried to Bylaw #183/23 to adopt the Village of Warburg /Leduc County Intermunicipal Development Plan and that Bylaw #163/19 be Repealed.

Bylaw #184/23

The first reading was given and carried to Bylaw #184/23 to Repeal the Intermunicipal Collaboration Framework between the Village of Warburg and Leduc County #165/19.

Bylaw #182/23

Second reading was given and carried regarding Bylaw #182/23 to Amend Land Use Bylaw 172/20.

The packaging may say "flushable" but please do not flush. Thanks!

******As per Bylaw #103/10 that regulates waterworks, wastewater and plumbing:***

Section X Wastewater lines and storm sewers:

1) g) No person shall interfere with the free discharge of any Village wastewater line or part thereof, or do any act or thing which may impede or obstruct the flow or clog up any Village wastewater line or appurtenance thereof.

No person shall throw, deposit or leave in or upon any Village sewer, or any trap, basin, grating, manhole or other appurtenance of any Village sewer any butcher's offal, garbage, litter, manure, rubbish, sweepings, sticks, stones, bricks, earth, gravel, dirt, mud, hay, straw, twigs, leaves, papers, rags, cinders, ashes or refuse matter of any kind, except feces, urine, the necessary closet paper, waste water and slops properly discharges through a private sewer into a Village sewer.
