

Acts in an advisory capacity to Council. The committee is comprised of six members of the community and two Leduc County Council members.





Understanding Anxiety for Kids

This session will help children who are experiencing anxiety to identify their emotions, understand what anxiety feels like, and how anxiety can affect their daily life. Through stories, activities, and discussion you'll learn about yourself and begin to build confidence in expressing and understanding these challenging feelings.

Calm and Confident: Tools for Managing Anxiety





Cat/Dog Licenses

Dog and cat licenses must be registered/renewed as of January 31st, 2025. Residents get a form at the Village office or they can be found on the www.warburg.ca website. A copy is included with the January 2025 Village of Warburg water bill.

Business Licenses

As per Bylaw 156/18, any person or persons operating a business or providing goods or services to the residents of the Village of Warburg must hold a current Business License. A Business License covers the calendar year of January 1 to December 31. The cost of such license is \$25.00/per year/per business for Home Based Businesses and Businesses located within the Village, and \$50.00 for businesses located outside of the Village, Hawkers/Peddlers and Single Projects.

Please note that the 39/20 Alliance allows for any business residing in one of the 4 municipalities within the Alliance (Breton, Calmar, Thorsby and Warburg) to purchase a Regional Business License from your residing community for an additional \$50.00, allowing you to do business in the other municipalities without having to purchase separate licenses from each one.
