
### About the presenter





# Get ready to file your income taxes

Tax season is almost here and now is the perfect time to start preparing! Getting ready early can help make sure you file your income tax and benefit return on time. It can also help you avoid delays or interruptions to any refund, benefit, or credit payments you're eligible for.

If you are eligible for any of the following tax credits or benefits, you must file your income taxes to continue receiving these payments:

- GST credit
- Canada Carbon Rebate
- Canada Child Benefit
- Canada Workers Benefit
- Guaranteed Income Supplement
- Alberta Seniors Benefit

# How to get ready for tax season:

- 1. Register or update your information using CRA's My Account.
- Start collecting your tax slips
- Find any deductions, credits, and expenses you may be able to claim to help reduce the amount
  of tax you have to pay.

You can file your 2024 tax return starting on February 24, 2025. To avoid late filing penalties and interest, you'll need to file your return and pay any amount you owe by April 30, 2025.

# Need help?

The Community Volunteer Income Tax Program (CVITP) can file income tax returns free of charge for people with low to modest income and a simple tax situation. This can include seniors, students, social assistance recipients and newcomers to Canada. Contact us for more information at 780-979-2385.







# Run for Council

Village of Warburg residents should plan to vote on October 20th, 2025, in Warburg's upcoming municipal election.

As a resident, this upcoming municipal election is a chance for you to exercise your right to vote and directly shape the direction of the Village of Warburg for the next four years.

Four Councillors and a Mayor will be elected to serve a four-year term on the Village of Warburg Council.

Prospective candidates: Are you interested in running for Village of Warburg Council and shaping the direction of the Village for the next 4 years? If so, you are encouraged to become a candidate!

Eligibility You are qualified to become a candidate if you are:

- · at least 18 years of age on nomination day
- · a Canadian citizen
- · a resident in the Village for the six consecutive months preceding nomination day
- your current property taxes are no more than \$50 in arrears

You are not eligible to become a candidate if:

- · You are the auditor of the municipality
- · Your current property taxes are more than \$50 in arrears
- You are in default for any other debt to the municipality in excess of \$500 for more than 90 days; or
- You have been convicted of any offense under the Local Authorities Election Act or the Canada Elections Act in the previous 10 years.

<u>Involvement</u> Council members have the opportunity to significantly influence the future of the Village of Warburg; this is an important and demanding job. If you are elected, you will hold office for a four-year term and will be required to attend the following:

- · regular and special council meetings
- council committee meetings
- meetings of other boards and agencies to which you are appointed as a council representative
- · conferences, conventions, seminars and workshops for training and discussion
- other events promoting our municipality

Time must also be spent reading agenda material and speaking with residents, the chief administrative officer and other relevant stakeholders in order to make informed decisions at meetings.

All candidates are required to file nomination papers prior to September 15<sup>th</sup>, 2025, the nomination day deadline. Candidates are encouraged to deliver his/her papers in person; however, anyone may file nomination papers on the candidates' behalf. Nomination papers must be signed by at least five voters eligible to vote in the election and who reside in the same electoral division as the candidate.

Nomination day deadline: September 15th, 2025, 12:00 pm noon

Election day: October 20th, 2025, from 10 am to 8 pm
