





POSITION SUMMARY: - Responsible for efficient implementation of the overall upkeep, repair and replacement programs of all existing municipal property and facilities in the Village of Warburg.

The Village of Warburg is looking for a highly motivated and well-organized individual to fill this position in a team environment, to work with other Public Work Employees. The part-time position is based on 40 hours per every two weeks (alternate between <u>2 and 3 day</u> weeks). Run for Council

Village of Warburg residents should plan to vote on October 20th, 2025, in Warburg's upcoming municipal election.

As a resident, this upcoming municipal election is a chance for you to exercise your right to vote and directly shape the direction of the Village of Warburg for the next four years.

Four Councillors and a Mayor will be elected to serve a four-year term on the Village of Warburg Council.

Prospective candidates: Are you interested in running for Village of Warburg Council and shaping the direction of the Village for the next 4 years? If so, you are encouraged to become a candidate!

Eligibility You are qualified to become a candidate if you are:

- at least 18 years of age on nomination day
- a Canadian citizen
- · a resident in the Village for the six consecutive months preceding nomination day
- your current property taxes are no more than \$50 in arrears

You are not eligible to become a candidate if:

- You are the auditor of the municipality
- Your current property taxes are more than \$50 in arrears
- You are in default for any other debt to the municipality in excess of \$500 for more than 90 days; or
- You have been convicted of any offense under the Local Authorities Election Act or the Canada Elections Act in the previous 10 years.

<u>Involvement</u> Council members have the opportunity to significantly influence the future of the Village of Warburg; this is an important and demanding job. If you are elected, you will hold office for a four-year term and will be required to attend the following:

- regular and special council meetings
- council committee meetings

 meetings of other boards and agencies to which you are appointed as a council representative

- · conferences, conventions, seminars and workshops for training and discussion
- other events promoting our municipality

Time must also be spent reading agenda material and speaking with residents, the chief administrative officer and other relevant stakeholders in order to make informed decisions at meetings.

Important dates to remember:

All candidates are required to file nomination papers prior to September 15th, 2025, the nomination day deadline. Candidates are encouraged to deliver his/her papers in person; however, anyone may file nomination papers on the candidates' behalf. Nomination papers must be signed by at least five voters eligible to vote in the election and who reside in the same electoral division as the candidate.

Nomination day deadline: September 15th, 2025, 12:00 pm noon

Election day: October 20th, 2025, from 10 am to 8 pm

Council moved that the Village appoint Donnelly & Co. LLP to complete the audit of the Financial Statements of the Village of Warburg for the year ended December 31, 2025.

Trugreen Commercial Proposal

Council approved a quote from TruGreen Commercial which includes spring broadleaf weed control for a 3 year term.

Amending Bylaw 171/20—Land Use Bylaw

Council gave third and final reading to the am endm ent of Bylaw 171/20 regarding Section 71: C1 Commercial Central District and the addition of Caretak er's Residence under Discretionary Uses.

Bylaw Infractions

Council moved that the Village obtain legal advice from a lawyer in regards to the Municipal Government Act Sections 545, 546 and 547 in regards to order to remedy contraventions.

Amending Bylaw 103/10—Water, Wastewater, Solid Waste and Recycling Bylaw

Council approved the amendment to Bylaw 103-10 to increase the replacement and new water meter fees.

Invite for an RCMP Real-Time Operation Centre Tour

Council moved that anyone wishing to attend the RCMP RTOC Tour in Edmonton be authorized to do so and that the required consent for release of criminal record information be completed by February 20th, 2025. The RCMP RTOC operates 24/7, tracks suspects in real time and provides officers on the ground instant support during emergency situations. It is the only one of its kind in Canada according to an article by Town and Country Today Staff.
